Investigator responsibilities

AFFINITY BM DNA/MRI SUB STUDY

DNA component: Analysis of DNA and other blood biomarkers of neurological recovery and response to therapy.

Site investigators will be paid Aus\$200.00 per participant.

MRI component: Consenting participants will undergo an additional MRI at baseline and another after completion of the 180 day follow up.

Site investigators will be paid Aus\$200.00 for each MRI scan.

Pathology and MRI costs will be covered as negotiated.

PROTOCOL AMENDMENT UPDATE

Since the last newsletter the proposed protocol amendment to the AFFINITY trial [protocol version 5] has received full HREC approval from all of the trials Lead HREC committees in WA, NSW, VIC, Olds, SA, ACT and New Zealand.

The key changes to the trial design and protocol are:

- Dispensing **six** months' supply of trial medication to the patient at randomisation (i.e. instead of two separate dispensations at baseline and 3 months)
- **No** mandatory blood tests at day 28 (hence day 28 follow up remains by the clinician, could be conducted by telephone, and is centred toward adherence to trial medication/adverse effects, tolerance of trial medication, and any secondary outcome measures such as depression, falls, stroke, seizures, etc)
- Following completion and submission of the Day 28 and **Day 90** follow up by the site the trial office sends a letter to the participant introducing the trial office and advising of importance of
 - o adherence to trial medication until 6 months after randomisation,
 - future contact from the trial office by phone +/- questionnaire for follow-up at 6 and 12 months,
 - o return of trial medication bottle after 6 month follow up, and
 - o contact details in the event of any questions regarding the trial.
- **Centralising** follow up after the day 90 visit (ie at 6 and 12 months) by telephone +/- postal questionnaire by the AFFINITY trial office in Perth.
- Return of trial medication to the trial office after 6 months follow-up contact will be coordinated by trial office.

Hence, investigator responsibilities will be

- 1. Randomisation, and
- 2. 28-day and 90-day follow up (face-to-face, phone or post)

Reimbursement to the study investigators will be \$1000 per participant.

The AFFINITY trial office has been working with sites around the country to submit the amendment for local governance site approval. Once this approval is received sites will be transitioned to protocol version 5 on the AFFINITY web site. We trust these amendments will facilitate recruitment at your site.



AFFINITY BM DNA/MRI SUB STUDY

The Assessment of Fluoxetine in Stroke Recovery (AFFINITY) trial Blood and Imaging Biomarker Sub-study: AFFINITY-BM sub study

The AFFINITY-BM sub study aims to complement the main AFFINITY trial by providing additional information about **blood** factors (e.g. genomic, proteomic) and **imaging** factors (e.g. functional MRI) that may help refine prediction of functional recovery after stroke and response to fluoxetine.

Blood biomarker study

All patients who have consented to participate in the AFFINITY trial are subsequently asked if they may consent to providing a **single blood sample** for analysis of DNA and other blood biomarkers of neurological recovery and response to therapy.

The blood samples will be processed, frozen and stored locally for batch shipment to Pathwest laboratories at QE11 Medical centre in Perth when appropriate.

The costs of laboratory processing, storage (as negotiated) and frozen shipment to Perth will be borne by the AFFINITY trial.

Site investigators will be paid Aus\$200.00 upon arrival at Pathwest, Perth of stored blood samples from each consenting participant.

MRI biomarker study


Patients who have consented to participate in the AFFINITY trial are subsequently asked if they may consent to undergoing two MRI brain scans - at baseline (within 3 weeks of randomisation) and at 6 months follow-up - according to a standardised protocol, for analysis of structural and functional brain biomarkers of neurological recovery and response to therapy.

The costs of the MRI (as negotiated) will be borne by the AFFINITY trial.

Site investigators will be paid Aus\$200.00 for the baseline MRI and \$200.00 for the follow-up MRI of each consenting participant.

Ethical approval has been granted for Western Australia and submission has been made to the lead HREC committee for NSW, VIC, QLD and SA and we are currently anticipating approval in the near future. Once this approval is in place the sub study will be submitted in the ACT and following that in New Zealand. Support will also be available to help site investigators with local governance applications should it be required.
